PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: Yes, Mr. President.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Brown, how much money will not be spent if your amendment is adopted, roughly?

SENATOR BROWN: This amendment would strike out the operating costs. A subsequent amendment would strike out the construction cost. The construction cost would mean that we would not spend \$500,000 and \$3.8 million in terms of construction.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So, together, that'd be four million two thousand or something like that, two hundred thousand altogether?

SENATOR BROWN: And...no, I'm sorry.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If you take the construction and the operating?

SENATOR BROWN: I'm sorry, that was the operations cost, and then the construction cost is another \$6 million.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So what would the total be if both amendments would be adopted? Close to \$10 million?

SENATOR BROWN: Over \$10 million.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'd like to ask my seatmate, Senator Thompson, a question, if she will yield.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute. Senator Thompson.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Thompson, how much money would be needed to do what needs to be done at Kearney and Geneva?

SENATOR THOMPSON: Estimates for Geneva are \$4.2 million,
