and we're still good friends, Senator Baker. I understand your position. That's no problem. By the way, I will come out and visit you some time and I hope you don't poison the food to get even with me. But the issue I really wanted to talk about, I want to ask Senator...Senator Wehrbein a question, if I could.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Wehrbein, could you yield?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Senator Wehrbein, do you have the numbers, and I suspect other members of the Appropriations Committee do, how much money have we actually put in the appropriation bill to do work out at the Kearney and York facility?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Kearney and York?

SENATOR VRTISKA: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I cannot give you that number off the top of my head. We do ordinary repair and maintenance. I don't think there's any new money in either...either one, Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay, that's...that's what I thought, and that's what really bothers me because I've heard so many stories about the situation out there. And Senator Chambers brought up the issue about the...about the Fire Marshal and not apparently doing what he considered his job out there. I think it's kind of interesting that the Fire Marshal spends a lot of time in various buildings that aren't nearly as...don't nearly have the problems that they do out there and yet apparently not a whole lot is being done out there. You know, I just had word from Richardson County that they're down there trying to get them to put sprinklers in the courthouse down there and I suspect probably it's as fireproof as this building is and we don't have very many sprinklers in this particular facility, but that's another issue, but it does really bother me, as Senator Chambers brought it up, that the Fire Marshal has a facility out there that appears is not very safe and, yet, we are incarcerating people out there and nobody seemed to be doing a whole lot of it, and I just wonder where...where our priorities really are at. I guess I...I have to tell you that I do support Senator
