SENATOR DW. PEDERSEN: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Is that really what you're...whose...under whose control they should be, whether under Corrections or Probation?

Because I recognize the dilemma that's going on and that's not my issue at this point as far as the knowledge I have on it. So thank you.
