construction money, towards the facilities master plan for Kearney and Geneva. So if that is something that you are interested in accomplishing, then support this amendment which would take out the 3.858,752 money in operations that would have gone towards the McCook Work Camp. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Brown. Senator Wehrbein, on the Brown amendment.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I'm going to strongly, strongly, strongly oppose this amendment and I'll tell you why; not so much the money, in fact I probably would support the amendment if we put in the new money, but I do think it's a terrible mistake, frankly, to break faith with the word that we have started the progress of the camp at McCook. If you want to do...I...we made the decision to do the work camp. As far as I'm concerned and to my knowledge today, the work camp is still a viable, valuable program to do as it was when we made the decision two years ago. If we do need to do something at Geneva and Kearney, and I acknowledge that Geneva, particular, needs some...needs some work and I do...we don't really have a full program statement, so you got to understand that as near as I can tell that this is just to do the master plan and to have perhaps start down the road for doing some things at Geneva. So it isn't...been on the front burner and I'm reluctant to do things as quickly on the floor without some thorough study and a knowledge of where it's headed and what it's going to take. But worst of all, I think, is that it's breaking faith with what we've done at McCook. Now we didn't decide McCook in this body. We said we'd have a work camp and that was a commitment made by the administration. I acknowledge that. But I believe that even for the sake of public relations in this state, if that's valuable to you at all, maybe it isn't to everybody, that to take that away from a community at this point, regardless of where they are located in this state, is a mistake. And if you truly think that this needs to be done, then let's put some new money into it and keep our commitments to what we've done and move forward with the areas that we should. That's the gist of my opposition to this, and I...I'll have to look at the amendment to see whether it can be done now or on Select File. If the body is inclined to do this, I'm going to still continue to try to put in some other money and
