not take it away from something that we've made a commitment to. The money that we're putting in there that is taken away is operating as offices, staffing for this thing at McCook. We've made a commitment to do that whether you agree or whether you don't. But there was no bill in, think about it, there's been no bill in. There's been no hearing on this issue. There was no bill introduced in January to take it away or to stop it. There's not been a hearing on that. I think it's atrocious the way we're dealing with a community regardless of where the community is. So if you really feel we ought to do it, let's be heads up about it, let's be forward about it. Let's put the money in, the necessary money to move forward and solve the dilemma at Geneva. I'm not...I'm not satisfied that Kearney is in that terrible shape at this point, I don't think. We toured that a year ago, and I think that there probably needs to be some long-term planning, there needs to be a feeling of how that fits in, or a sense of how that fits in with the total correctional system, I acknowledge that. And I acknowledge that there is a problem at Geneva, and I'm surprised that there hasn't been something been put forward sooner than this, then here it show up, I admit maybe not today because Senator Thompson has talked about it previously. But if we're going to, let's swallow hard and do the money and do what's right for both communities if that's what it takes.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Hilgert, on the Brown amendment to LB 880.

SE.ATOR HILGERT: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you. Thank you, Mr. President, and members. I want to make sure I have the numbers straight here. I got a handout from Senator Thompson that says the Geneva facility needs totals of \$4.2 million which includes the 25-bed housing unit to replace Dunbar as well as a multipurpose 16-bed intake facility. The Kearney project would be \$6 million to renovate the housing units, the 75 beds, and then a multipurpose program and training facility of \$1 million, which is \$7 million. You add both the Geneva and the Kearney together and we get \$11.2 million. Now what exactly is this amendment, what's the amount of the amendment that we're striking? I assume...I heard...I heard Senator Brown say 3.858,752. Now can you explain, Senator Thompson, can you talk about this because I don't see Senator Brown...oh, here's
