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favor of this amendment is trying to pull a fast shuffle. If it is shown that the amendment does not do what we're saying our intent is, we wouldn't have any objection to amending it to make sure that happens. As far as owing something to a community, all any Governor would have to do to bind a Legislature is run out and turn a shovel of dirt someplace and say, well, now that I've done that, the Legislature is bound to do and follow along. We are the policymakers, not the Governor, and that Governor waited until he was virtually out of office, then ran back to his hometown as fast as his little short legs would carry him, asked Senator Baker could he borrow a spade from his...his retail establishment. Senator Baker said, I don't know what you want it for, but if you're not going to split my skull with it, here you go, Governor. He took that spade and ran to this piece of ground and pushed that spade in the ground, Senator Baker, and turned over some dirt and said now the state is obligated from now till eternity. That's not the way business is done, and if the Governor made a bad decision on his own and it was political, that does not bind the Legislature, certainly doesn't bind me. You look at the penological benefits of any project and that is not a sound project. Its placement is not sound. And Senator Crosby knows that I was with her in fighting these boot camps by whatever name they were called.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President, and I was the one no vote. I voted against it and, remember, that is an adult operation. That is not going to benefit juveniles at all. That is an adult operation, and you're not going to rehabilitate or teach or train anybody who is an adult in six months anything. It was one of those harebrained political moves by a Governor leaving office, and I think it was a mistake for us to do it. My votes showed it and I think now we have a chance to correct some of that. But even with the adoption of this amendment, the statutory language remains unchanged that gives a 2005 finish date for that fiasco.
