the Legislature, I'm not sure where to start here but, representing McCook, I've been trying to follow along the history of this. I realize that people are telling me this delays the completion...or does not delay the completion dates in statute, 2005. It postpones construction. I don't know what our credibility is going to be. You're all aware of the controversy surrounding a site selection. I may be representing a different state in another year. I don't know if we secede from the state of Nebraska, we might go to Kansas or Colorado. That might change the Kansas-Nebraska lawsuit too, who knows. But our credibility, I can imagine the turmoil that's going on out there right now as we discuss this, and I don't know where it's going to head. But I firmly believe that the needs of both projects should stand on their own. Senator Wehrbein made an excellent point. We're cooking numbers and changing things around here on the floor after the appropriations process has gone through. I don't deny that Kearney and Geneva need help. I sit on the Judiciary Committee. I've saw those pictures and listened to that testimony. But we determined prior years that we were going to go ahead with a boot camp. The money was appropriated to buy the land. It's been purchased. I don't know the status of the utilities out there right now, but I know that the land has been purchased and an awfully lot of the planning and so on. The contracts are going to be let here in another three weeks, I believe, for the actual construction. But I think they should stand on...both stand on their own needs, and the work camp is unique to the state of Nebraska. We don't have one...anything like that. I think we need to get one going. It was in the budget, obviously. We need to go ahead and maintain our credibility here as best we can and get the thing built, and then if we want to address Kearney and Geneva yet this budget process, fine. We can work with the Appropriations Committee and possibly do some other things there, but the whole argument is we need to maintain the course, I guess, on this. We are obligated to build the thing, have it completed by 2005. The process has started. Let's go ahead and do it and then...and look at the Kearney and Geneva situations separately and work with Appropriations Committee. Senator Wehrbein said he can do this, Senator Engel, likewise, echoes that, that we can work this thing out and we need to get it going, and from there see that we can find the money. We can possibly change some priorities on something else but this thing
