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appointments. And nobody on the floor said anything about it because that was the prerogative of the Governor coming in. One Legislature cannot bind another one. And the constitution was written in that fashion, because every session of the Legislature, even a given session of the Legislature can observe, can "unobserve", can observe again, and we're not to be put in a straitjacket. And that's why anything we enact this year we can abolish next year. Whatever we enacted last year, we can repeal this year. And now we're being told not something the Legislature did, but something that a Governor did, going out of office, a politician trying to line his nest so he'll have a better chance to get in the U.S. Senate did, is going to bind this Legislature. You all can bind me by voting to go along with him, but you can't stop me from fighting against what it is you seem determined to do. Now what somebody might stand on the floor, and they'd be justified in doing it, is saying that the majority of people who have spoken have spoken for this amendment. The only ones who spoke against it were Senator Wickersham, Senator Wehrbein, Senator Don Pederson. I don't know if any others did or not, because, see, I was busy on this floor trying to negotiate. What business does a black man have negotiating an issue that involves white people?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That doesn't make sense. But it shows we're not too old to learn. And it also shows we don't get too old to be tricked. Oh, I was tricked royally today, but it won't work again. I'm a fast study. I learn, so don't you-all be coming around here to me with any of these ideas about how we can work together on this and get something done. On the piddling stuff you're willing. Then on something as serious as this...I can't buy it.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Thompson, on the motion to bracket LB 880.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the body, I think we're now down to a discussion on process. And so I would like to frame this the way I see it. We have some serious concerns about the McCook work camp. And a decision on the Brown amendment would delay the implementation of some things
