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But I don't think this should be an economic development issue. I think this issue should be about kids, kids who are living in facilities that we have serious concerns about, serious safety concerns, serious administrative concerns. And that, unfortunately, has to come first. So I will be back with LB 652, with the cigarette tax, if this doesn't go. So you do have options. You have three options. This is one of them. This is a trade, a trade-off.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR THOMPSON: It's a difficult decision and I know it's a difficult process decision, but it comes down, to me, to what are the needs of the youth that are in these facilities and that maybe they are more important than developing a new adult facility. Step that back for a few years and fund it in this fashion. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Thompson. Senator Engel.

SENATOR ENGEL: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature, I just wanted to bring to your attention one more thing here that the court may place an offender in an incarceration work camp for a period not to exceed 180 days as a condition of sentence or probation. The reason I wanted to preface my remarks with that, in talking to the Corrections people out here, they figure on placing 3 groups in there per year, 4 months at a time, so they get 300 people through that...300 persons through the work camp each year. If someone needs more time than that, then they can keep them longer. They can keep them up to six months, that's in the bill. So as far as what Senator Brown said, it cost \$20,000 a year versus \$19,000, I can't remember her figures, but I hope she's listening, the...it would be about \$11,000 per year, because \$400,000 of the appropriation is for the probation after they get out of the work camp. So it's about \$11,000 per incarcerate. So it's not...and that's much, much cheaper than the 19 or 20 thousand dollars in the prison. Another thing, and I told her earlier that even if it was the same amount of money, it's still more cost effective, because these people are being rehabilitated and are being prepared to go out into society
