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can treat the young people of this state before they get to that criminal state. And so I think that we can actually save dollars by doing this. I do support the Brown amendment. I hope that we can take this on a vote, up or down. Decide in your best interest where you think...or decide in your own mind where you think the best interests of the state of Nebraska lies. For me I think that is with the YRTCs, improving those so that we can improve and have a better outcome on our young people. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Jensen. Senator Thompson, on the motion to bracket LB 880. Senator Thompson.

SENATOR THOMPSON: I'll waive.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Wickersham, on the motion to bracket.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Mr. President, what I hear people talking about is what they view as essentially two mistakes that were made and trying to find a way to correct either one or both of those mistakes. One mistake that I hear some people saying that we made was passing Senator Engel's bill to create the work camps in the first place. I'll confess, as I think Senator Chambers did, that I had grave reservations about that kind of legislation and never supported it before last year, in fact I'd always voted against it. But for a variety of reasons, last year, I voted for it. And it's in...and a bunch of you did, too, and it's now in the statutes. If that was a mistake, we're not going to be able to correct that with this bill, because you actually have to go out and change other substantive provisions in Nebraska law. If the other mistake that we're trying to correct was siting a facility at McCook, then I'm not sure that this is the way to do that either. And it is that attempt to find a way to resolve what some people believe were essentially two different mistakes that I think we're engaged in. And, as I've indicated before, we can have these discussions on the floor, and we can make up our minds to change things, but I think it is also incumbent when we make those decisions that we understand what we're doing, what the ramifications of them are, and decide rather carefully if, indeed, that is what we want to do.
