PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...we don't like this, it's over. Well, if the three of them can do that, then one of me can do what I'm trying to do in my humble, ineffective, little way. And I just might ask for a reconsideration, if I don't get my way on this bracket motion, because we're going to be here, and there are some, especially the new people, who wonder if I can talk all day long. So I don't want to let anybody down. Mr. President, I would ask for a call of the house.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Please record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The house is under call. Would all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Would all unexcused members please return to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. Senator Beutler, could you check in, please? Thank you, Senator. Senator Bruning, could you please check in? Thank you, Senator. Senator Dwite Pedersen, Senator Matzke, the house is under call. The house is under call. Senator Matzke. The question is to bracket LB 880. Those in favor vote aye, ..we have a request for a roll call in reverse order. Mr. Clerk, when you're ready, please call the roll.
