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the Legislature, but by those who deal with these kind of matters, I mean correctional matters, to see if that is the best location for this facility, if it is in fact to be completed? Or do you think that it should be considered closed?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator, I don't...in fact I'm not very aware of what the selection process involved in that particular instance. But I think that we, the taxpayers of the state of Nebraska, deserve a selection process that assures that the facility is located at the place where it can be most efficient and effective within the system, and that ultimately our costs, whether you calculate those in terms of immediate construction costs, or ongoing operation costs, are minimized or at levels that we find acceptable. If that isn't what the selection process involved, then I think we should reexamine the selection process, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is there any way that a provision such as that could be put into one of these budget bills?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: I don't know, Senator Chambers. Normally, I would say that that would involve substantive legislation. And, as I understand it, budget bills are usually not used for substantive legislation, but on the other hand substantive bills often aren't used...are not supposed to be used for appropriations, and we've done that. So I'm not going to say that we couldn't do something of that nature, but there are...I better be careful, because I think there are some constitutional constraints, but you're probably more aware of those than I am.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Wickersham. I would like to ask Senator Wehrbein a question.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Wehrbein, would you respond to a question, please?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I'll be...

SENATOR COORDSEN: We have a little over a minute, little less than a minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'll state it because the time is going to
