SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Wehrbein, is there any way, through a budget bill, that we could put that intent that that process of site selection be reopened?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I think it would more properly on construction bill rather than the op...if that's...if that be your desire, probably on the construction bill.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But it could be considered there?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I assume it could, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. That's all I would have. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you. Senator Jones, please.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President, members of the body, I haven't talked on this yet, but there's being an amendment being drafted up right now that's coming down, I don't know just what it's all going to say. But I would have supported Senator Brown's amendment that would allow removing some of the money from out there to the work camp and using it now, and then replacing it later or something like that. But anyway, with the amendment, I think, coming down, well, hopefully it will do what we want. But I was out to Geneva and looked the situation over, and I was appalled that we haven't done anything out there and just been letting it go. And I understand that they came to the Appropriations Committee a year ago and never got their money. And then now Senator Thompson is trying to do it with a cigarette tax, and that's not going anyplace. So I hope this amendment comes down that will help support that, and maybe we can get something moving here today on it, because I think that that's really important to do something out there at Geneva. And I don't know whether it's going to include York, Kearney, or what it's going to include. But I never was at York or Kearney, but I was at Geneva, and I think we really need to do something there.
