incarceration work camp be made from this appropriation or any reappropriated amounts until the siting decision is reviewed by the Department of Corrections and a report of their findings is delivered to the Executive Board of the Legislature no later than December 1, 1999." What this is saying, I'll repeat it again, having read the language, that the Department of Corrections will study that situation and, along the lines of Senator Landis' last presentation to us, will determine what the purpose of this camp is to be; where it can be located in the state, all things being considered, that would give it the best chance of achieving that purpose. In order not to have inordinate delays, the Department of Corrections would have to deliver a report to the Executive Board by December 1st of this year. No expenditures could be made from the money appropriated or any amounts that are reappropriated. This amendment is not striking anything from the bill. It's placing conditions which must be met before there can be any expenditures. So the effect of this is to say that no money can be spent...I was looking (laugh) at some of my colleagues eating and all of a sudden I almost lost it. Funniest thing I've seen today. (Laugh) Excuse me. I ought to keep my eyes on what I'm supposed to be dealing with. Until that study is presented by the Department of Corrections to the Executive Board, there can be no expenditures. By that report having to come to the Executive Board by December 1st, we will have time, first thing next year, to make a determination of what we're going to do relative to establishing a site. Now there is nothing existing in statute right now which says where the boot camp is to be located. There is nothing in statute right now which directed where that maximum security prison should have been located. On the prison, the statute provided that the Director of Corrections would make the decision. A search committee or a site committee was established and you-all, who followed the newspaper, know what happened as a result of that. But the ultimate end is that the prison is to be built at Tecumseh. I wish that Senator Dwite Pedersen, I and others could short-circuit that, but that's a different matter. On this boot camp, it was understood that the boot camp would be located near the prison. There was nothing about Tecumseh to recommend it as the place for this boot camp to be located. It is far away from everywhere. Most of the people who might wind up there would have to travel across the state and a judge, being practical, might decide that
