SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and if they could not then I wouldn't be opposed to language that would make it possible should it be necessary.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Do you think that's necessary that we have that language in there?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: We could do it on Select File, but we don't think it's necessary.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And when I say "we", I have the help of somebody who is much more expert on budgetary matters than I am.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right. Thank you, Senator Chambers. Thank you. I'll give the rest of my time back to Senator Chambers, if he'd like to have it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, did you wish to...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What I will say from that discussion, excuse me one second, let the...how much time is left?

SENATOR CUDABACK: About...almost two minutes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, it can run, and I'm going to go into consultation just for a second. Mr. President, members of the Legislature and Senator Janssen, probably the operating budget of Corrections could absorb it, but, again, if there's any problem, between now and Select we can get all of that worked out. But I'm like you, it's such a minor point I don't think it's anything to be concerned about.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Baker, on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. I guess a question of Senator Chambers, if he'd respond. I...
