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so they approach the department. This is going to be different because it's not up for bids to say who can offer the most. They would look at where they think the best place is for it. Then they would also take into consideration the response of any community.

SENATOR BROMM: See, what I'm trying to get at is whether...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...and I haven't made this very clear, but whether their mission is to review the siting decision that was made at that...at McCook, or whether it is to review the entire alternatives around the state that might be available to them and compare that with the McCook site. That...that's what I'm...there's a difference, in my opinion,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR BROMM: ...as to what you're telling us.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: My intent is not that they make a comparison, but that they start with a clean slate. And the reason "review" was meant...was used, not "reassessment", the department did not make that decision, the Legislature did not, and I didn't want any language to make it appear that they had been involved in that original locating of it at McCook. So if different language would make you comfortable, again, I'm not opposed to that.

SENATOR BROMM: I think some language might need to be looked at,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BROMM: ...not necessarily this minute. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Chambers, there are no more lights on. Do you wish to close on your amendment?
