and out. A part of it has to do with...taking money from excess lands sales. That will take place over time. Particularly, the Omaha School for the Deaf building sites will come into the fund, go back out of the fund to pay for various things, as I've said, particularly the Omaha...the roofs and so forth. And it continues over on the back page, if you want to follow down the sequence of events that are to happen. And the result at the end of the whole thing is a zero to the General Fund cost over the next two years, if everything works like it is. I might have to give you a second to digest all that if you're so interested. It's fairly complicated, but this is the most informative sequence that we have, and I can't really improve upon it. But it does get what we need done accomplished. It does sell some excess buildings that we have, particularly the Omaha School for the Deaf. Those funds will be transferred into the proper funds so that repairs can be made on the projects, as I said: State Office Building, Omaha; State Office Building in Lincoln; new roofs; and the Governor's security around the mansion. I will try to answer any questions.
