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but since I don't have the choice to pay the claim to everyone who did not meet that deadline then I, in fairness, have to deny those that came to us. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Redfield. Senator Janssen, on the committee amendments to LB 882.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor and members of the Legislature. I don't...the thought of setting a precedence here, I don't believe that holds up because each claim that is brought is judged on its own merit, such as we're doing today. There again, you can look at it this way, two wrongs don't make a right either, and I realize that, but the sales tax situation in this state is a little difficult to follow. I know I have brought sales tax problems in front of the Revenue Committee that I thought...that I thought were right on and...and the Revenue Committee did not think so and, of course, I was trying to change the statutes so that we could...we could solve that situation. Well, in that particular instance, I told the Revenue Committee at that hearing what was going to happen, you're going to lose some of these companies if you keep doing it the way we're doing it right now and charging sales tax on certain items. Well, that...that is going to happen, the particular case that I brought for them. I'm sure that that company is going to move its printing shop out of the state of Nebraska. That's another story. I don't really understand the situation that well here. Senator Schmitt said every one of us got a letter from this particular company. Well, if I did, I probably read it and threw it away. That...that could happen. But, you know, when was it discovered? Whose...was it a...was it a difference of opinion? Senator Vrtiska, maybe you could answer a couple of questions for me. Senator, was it...was it an error on the preparers who prepared the sales tax return statement, or was it a difference of opinions on...on how the tax was owed? Do you recall that?

SENATOR VRTISKA: (Microphone not activated.) Well, as I...

SENATOR JANSSEN: If you would answer, please.

SENATOR VRTISKA: (Microphone not activated.) (inaudible).
