SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...for the colonies to rebel. Everybody on this floor knows better than to do what Senator Schmitt and Senator Vrtiska are asking us to do. Everybody knows it. This is one of those cases where our knowledge and our understanding, as representatives of the state, should come into play and we would reject this proposal that is being offered to us this morning.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Preister, on the committee amendments.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Honorable President. Before us in the committee amendments we have two distinct claims, and I would ask for a ruling of the Chair. I would like a division of the question between those two distinct claims.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Chair rules they are divisible. The division will be lines 1 through 6 as the first division, and 7 through 12 as the second division. Senator Vrtiska, do you have a preference on which would be taken up first?

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. President. I would request that the second claim be...on the \$25,000 be heard first and then the other one second.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Okay, the question is now, and we will discuss lines 7 through 12 of the divided committee amendments. Senator Chambers. (FA130 is found on page 1744 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, to help sharpen our focus, since we've divided these two claims, I'd like to ask Senator Vrtiska one or two questions.
