PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Debate is ceased. To close on the first part of the divided committee amendments, Senator Vrtiska.

I guess the choice falls in your hands now to see if you want to follow through what the committee decided or if you want to deny the claim. The decision's certainly up to you. And, with that, I will turn my time back. This is...this, by the way, is the second claim, which is the claim on the Printing Company. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. The question is the adoption of Floor Amendment 130 to LB 882. Those in favor vote aye; those opposed nay. Senator Hilgert, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR HILGERT: Call the house, please.
