Labor Committee having made that kind of information available to the Legislature, so, in effect, those claims are never reviewed by us. But if somebody can get a majority of the members of the Business and Labor Committee to pluck one of those claims out of that indefinitely postponed bill, there will be some information on that provided so that the Legislature will understand what is entailed, at least in general, in that claim, so some kind of rational decision can be made as to whether or not to grant it. PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Vrtiska?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But you know that it's not in Egypt, this particular one.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Yes. (Laugh)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, I'm with you on that. Thank you,
