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committee has done in this claims bill. Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Hilgert. On the motion to reconsider, Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes, Mr. President and members. Senator Wickersham wasn't able to convince the whole neighborhood over here that we should reconsider this vote. Let me first...Senator Preister's issue with the airplane, friend all that he is, goes to show what he doesn't know about airplanes involved with spraying. First of all, only one person can get in. They're specially equipped. You have to file a flight plan, so if he wanted to fly to church he'd have to file a flight plan that he was flying to church. I mean that, I believe, is...doesn't apply at all. I think the real issue in that case that we need to pay attention to is the fact that when the people filled out the form the state of Nebraska, not the person filling out the form, the state of Nebraska did not have on the form the correct information since we had changed the law. Now whose fault is that? Certainly not the poor people who think that they're filing and doing their taxes exactly according to the form that they're filling out. And then, if we aren't going to do this, why do we even have the Claims Court? Why have it? If we aren't going to allow the people to come to the state to say, look, I pay taxes in this state, I have an issue? The issue on that one happens to be that the state did not, on the form, they had...they had just changed the law and the form did not, did not, reflect the change in the law. This wasn't their fault. And so I...and so then the Department of Revenue didn't pick it up that there was an error until the statutes of limitations had passed. So if we shouldn't deal with it, who should? It's not their fault. And that's exactly, I think, what the Claims, our final place to appeal, from people, who are average citizens, can come to us and say, I did what I was supposed to do, the state messed up. It's not their fault the statutes of limitations had gone out. It's not their responsibility. It's the Department of Revenue. If they can't put it on the form when the people fill it out and then don't tell them until after the time is passed that, oh, by the way, it's not their fault, and that's precisely why we have the process before us and why the committee, under their recommendation, says that we should recognize this claim. It
