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seems to me that it's what we have for the common people in Nebraska who come forward and say this is not fair, we're asking you to make a judgment. We go through this every year. Every year we have some real heated debate and arguments over these issues. In this case, with the sprayer, I think the issue that they use the airplane for other things is ridiculous. The issue about the statutes of limitation, which really we should be talking about, that is the issue, the reasons that it had run out was not the fault of the person applying. It was the fault of the Department of Revenue. Therefore, we, as a state, should recognize when we did not have the right forms and we should make restitution to the people because it was not their fault and we should admit it. And, therefore, the reconsider vote, I would hope if you vote to reconsider, I still will be back up on the floor because I know about this claim and I believe that we were in the wrong and these people have a very, very valid issue. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. On the motion to reconsider, Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. President. I appreciate the fact Senator Bohlke did point out exactly what I intended to point out and that is, in fact, this was an error that was made I think, from what I've been able to learn, from the state of Nebraska and, as a result, this person should not be penalized because somebody in government made a mistake, and I think that's the worst scenario that we could ever address. That's why I'm glad that Senator Bohlke brought this issue before you. I intended to talk about it at length on the next bill if we do, in fact, move ahead to that point, and at this point I will give my time back to the Chair and wait for the final discussion on this particular amendment to reconsider. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. On the motion to reconsider, Senator Kristensen.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. There's going to be a number of times between now and the end of session where, at first glance, something's going to be very clear to you and this morning you've had a taste of what it's like, I believe, to be in the Appropriations
