PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...not being done properly by the Department of Revenue. That...my understanding is that that does not apply to this claim that we're talking about that we're reconsidering. Senator Bohlke, is that correct? Could I ask you a question?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Bohlke?

SENATOR BOHLKE: That's correct, Senator Bromm, and, as I said to you, I...I was...my concern is if people might think they would have to be consistent.

SENATOR BROMM: I understand, but I just didn't want a misunderstanding that that argument applied to this claim, because my understanding is it does not. So thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Bromm. The question is, shall the vote on Floor Amendment 130 be reconsidered? Those in favor vote aye; those opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to reconsider.
