PRESIDENT MAURSTAD:      Time.      Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      Could we get a division of the question?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD:      The question is divisible.      The first section will be page 1 of AM1412, along with line 1 on page 2. The second part of the divided question will be lines 2 through 14, on page 2 of AM1412.      Senator Vrtiska, which part of the divided question would you like to take up first?

SENATOR VRTISKA:      I'd like to take up the second part, starting on line...on page 2, line 2, for the first part.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD:      It is...Senator Chambers, you're recognized to speak to part one of the divided question, lines...actually, it's part two, excuse me, line 2 through 14, on page 2.      (See FA139 on page 1753 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      Mr. President, not to be difficult, shouldn't one of the people who support it open on it?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD:      Well, I checked with the Clerk, prior to my recognizing you, for procedure.      And since we had opened on the amendment, now it's divided, continuing with discussion, I'll check again with the Clerk, if you'll hold for a moment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      Okay.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD:      Senator Vrtiska, we'll recognize you to open on this section of the divided question.

SENATOR VRTISKA:      Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body.
