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"out-of-state" in front of "participants". Then the identical language would appear in both places, because it is only spending out-of-state...spending by out of state participants that can be counted.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, so that's the intent there. Okay. Well, let me stick with that definition and ask you...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Let me ask you further, is there an addendum to that response, or are we...is that still the response? I think I'm going to have to press my light again, Mr. Speaker. In fact, why don't I just wait, because this really is at a breaking point in terms of my questions.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Further discussion on the Chambers amendment to the committee amendments? Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I have been opposed to this...the bill. I voted against it in committee, and I think I owe it to you to explain some of my concerns. I want to express right at the beginning what some of my concerns are not, and that is that it's not that I want Omaha to not have a convention center, in fact, the opposite is the case. I would...I would like very much for Omaha to be successful with a convention center, if that's the desires of the citizens of Omaha. I really would prefer not to...not to get involved in the decision, which I think is theirs. My concern comes from what is proper state tax policy. Because really that's the context in which this discussion occurs. I see Senator Wickersham...there he is. In a moment I wanted to ask Senator Wickersham a question or two. To go on a little bit, what I'm interested in doing is I want to focus at the moment on the part one, which we're discussing, and in particular try to get some clarification. Senator Wickersham, you mentioned that one of the objectives here is to enrich the state, in other words, make money. Am I correct on that?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Wickersham?
