PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator, I'm at a loss to respond. It depends on what kinds of activ...I would speculate that it depends on what kind of activities you intend to conduct and what revenues you can generate per seat as opposed to...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But there's...there's nothing in the statute that makes any reference to seating capacity,...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...is there?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: There don't even have to be seats.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Um...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You...you could...you could put a Quonset hut if you chose to and not have seats and put on some of these events and give the state...you keep 30 percent, 70 percent and give the state 30 percent. Is there anything, in other words, in this bill that says how much in terms of dollars must be generated by this activity, or we're only talking about percentages of whatever happens to be generated?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Only percentages of what happens to be generated.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I believe my time is up, so....

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time. Senator Chambers, you may continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you have any idea, based on the testimony you got, you had presented to the committee, what they think the seating capacity has to be in order to make one of these things profitable?
