SENATOR LANDIS: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...I want you to.

SENATOR LANDIS: My notion is this, and this is what I was trying to say and, by the way, I might be in error here, I might have not said this clearly in giving instructions. You decide what's regional, national, or international based on registration and attendance of people, 50 percent of whom come from outside of Nebraska.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, they don't have to attend to determine the nature of the gathering.

SENATOR LANDIS: I think they do based on the participant definition in (9). That's my reading. People register and attend from outside the state, got to have 50 percent of them from outside the state. When that happens you have a genuinely regional, national, international. It hasn't been here for the last three years so this is new income. To the extent there are Nebraskan participants, they would have gone to Minneapolis, Chicago, Denver, some place else, but this conference...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...wouldn't have been held here, so their money is new income attributable to the project and is part of the throwback. That was the working theory, and to the extent that it's not captured by language, I could...I could be at fault in not giving clear instructions.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And, Senator Landis, I hope you understand that my questioning is not to lay blame, but just to point out what I see in the language here not being clear and telling us what's supposed to be. And I don't want it clarified by an amendment, by the way, because I didn't offer any amendments in this area, you'll notice.

SENATOR LANDIS: I know, I noticed. I noticed.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President.
