SENATOR LANDIS: Um-hum.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...on how you determine the nature of this event, whether it's regional, national, or international.

SENATOR LANDIS: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Landis.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, and I haven't finished asking the question yet. Then we get down in the next subsection to what a participant is.

SENATOR LANDIS: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, you said you believe that there would be a required attendance of 50 percent of these people from outside Nebraska, based on the definition in subsection (8), or did I misunderstand you?

SENATOR LANDIS: In subsection (9).

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. But in subsection (8) all you need to have is the registration.

SENATOR LANDIS: Notice however that the word that's being used there is a participant, and there I import the meaning from (9) into (8), even though the thing that happens in (8) would occur earlier in time. Registration occurs earlier in time. However, I think a partici...only a person who registered and attended could be a participant. Why? Because that's the meaning of number...section (9). A participant is only somebody who registers and attends. Therefore, when it's used in subsection (8), even though it's talking about only the registration process, by using the word "participant" it would be somebody who registers and ultimately also attends.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You could put that in subsection (8) if you wanted to.
