SENATOR LANDIS: You could. I think it operates that way when you define the term "participant" and then use that term throughout the whole act. That's what you...that's why you define a term in the definition section, so that you can use that term and import its meaning everywhere you use it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, in the earlier discussion, I had stated it as my opinion that you would have to have 50 percent, or whatever that is, of these people from outside Nebraska actually attending.

SENATOR LANDIS: And, by the way, I would agree with that understanding. To the extent language doesn't capture that, it should. I think it does, but that's an open question. I agree to the principle that says 50 percent or more of the attendees should come from outside the state of Nebraska and I think we agree on that as an operating principle here.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, that's why I phrased a question about one of these definitions being looser than the other, allowing that which the other didn't. But let me...let me put it to you this way.

SENATOR LANDIS: Yeah, okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If we get to subsection (9):...

SENATOR LANDIS: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ..."Participant means a person registered to attend and shown to have attended".

SENATOR LANDIS: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: They've got to register and they have to have attended.

SENATOR LANDIS: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If that meaning is put into subsection (8),...
