hear the samples of the records and other things they play of the kind of groups they expect this convention center to draw to Omaha. They're not educational conferences. They're not the kind of people that Senator Landis talked about, military officers. And when we have to reach that far to justify something like this, it shows that it has very little merit. Now, when the farmers drove their tractors to Washington, DC, and tore up the mall, there were many articles where the waitresses were very angry because, Senator Wickersham said I don't tip, farmers would tip a nickel, and I clipped the articles, and they were very hostile to the farmers who came to Washington, DC. Because they wanted top service, they made a lot of noise, they drove out other customers, then they wouldn't tip. So that's not what they're trying to draw to Omaha, and again, we're being very frank and realistic because the community of which I'm a part is going to be asked to underwrite a \$210 million project, one which, if it is improved, will ensure that the areas of the city which have been neglected all these years will continue to be neglected. So we're just going to have to at least take some time on this and look at various aspects of it and see how many things are not as they ought to be. And maybe there will be 33 votes to move it and I hope in a way that there are, because the committee amendments will be adopted as they are. If I could be guaranteed that there'd be no amendments offered to these committee amendments, maybe I could go for them, as bad as they are, especially when it comes to how the board votes. You don't know whether it takes three votes or two votes because it says a majority, but not a majority of what. And then some of these other things that they have in here. One of them I'd like to ask one of my colleagues about, and I think since Senator Smith is the newest...one of the newest members of our group, I'm going to ask him.
