SENATOR LANDIS: Those two things have to happen, I think.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now these are the kind of things...the kind of events that we're talking about which can go toward attributable income, and correct me if I'm wrong.

SENATOR LANDIS: Can you give me a site, Ernie, while you're doing that?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Page 3...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...starting in line 11.

SENATOR LANDIS: That's true.

SENATOR LANDIS: I don't see them qualifying. By the way, a convention center usually doesn't have an auditorium for that kind of a thing. That would be an arena and there is no arena in this bill.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then those...those kind of advertisements, if what I'm saying is true, that have all these rock stars being promoted by the radio stations as the kind of events...

SENATOR LANDIS: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that will come here would not even be involved in this that we have in this bill.
