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faith, by raising the issue of wetlands and water on the site, then I guess I don't understand what bad faith is. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD:      Thank you, Senator Preister.      Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS:      Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature.      I have to make a couple more comments about especially some of the things that Senator Brashear said.      He mentioned at some point during his rhetoric that heads should roll.      I happened to make that same statement on this floor at the time that Ray Peery was arrested for taking \$800,000 worth of the compact money and buying fine things for himself and friends.      And my remark was directed at the...at the management of NPPD and OPPD, because this man had not allowed an audit on his books for three years, and yet these power companies were spending millions of dollars, at that time had spent millions of dollars to provide for this particular facility, and they weren't even businessmen enough to see that their money was being audited.      Three years without an audit.      Is that responsible, Senator Brashear?      I wonder where responsibility really comes from or where it goes to?      The study by the law firm that Senator Brashear and Senator Beutler asked for came back with the decision that I liked, and I thought most everybody else liked, but evidently that isn't the opinion that Senator Brashear liked, because he still seems to think that we have liability that law firm didn't think we had.      I'm not sure what the purpose of the study was then, Senator Brashear?      We spent \$60,000 for that, assuming we were going to get something we could trust.      I think we did.      The site simply is not licensable, it's just that simple.      You can go through all the rhetoric you want to about the inconsistencies of the licensing and all that stuff, and who said what to whom, but the basic fact is the site is not licensable.      It's a wetlands that became available because it was for sale, and US Ecology gave \$1,000 an acre for this piece of land, and they've never sold a piece of land in Boyd County for \$1,000 an acre.      I don't think they've sold any for \$500 an acre.      So who's kidding who here?      This site is just simply not licensable, that's the fact.      Senator Hilgert says that the board of directors for OPPD had a fiduciary responsibility to their voters.      And I don't disagree with that.      But what I might disagree with is what was their
