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controlling. But to return, things have changed since the opinion. As I indicated, the license has been denied. The suit has been filed. We can color the status of that suit any way we want to and we're not damaging that suit because everybody is basically talking about what's already on the public record. When I look at page 2 of the temporary restraining order, it says, by the judge in his own hand, in fact, the commission has a very strong argument that the state of Nebraska and others engaged in and continue to engage in a purposeful violation of the compact. A purposeful violation of the compact, which is a contract, brings us to the issue of damages. Senator Kristensen has pointed out the risk of specific performance, as we call it in the law, the fact that we might be ordered, he didn't say we would be, but he said he's concerned about the court ordering us to specifically perform. We don't know whether the court can do that or not, but if the court orders us to specifically perform, then we will have the site. Gee, do we want to be out of the compact that has the site, not have a chair at the table? The thing that worries me is that we are, what is referred to in the vernacular, a deep pocket.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: The fact is that if we are found to be in violation, and there can be other violations of contract than bad faith violations, if we're found to be in violation or default with regard to the compact, we're a target defendant. We're a deep pocket, supposedly endless sums of money all of which will come from the taxpayers. So that brings us to the conclusion; if we don't have a mind-set that was predetermined in a different time under a different set of facts, if we are not, so to speak, hellbent for leather to do what we're going to do, whether it makes any sense or not, where are we today given all these things?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time. (Visitors introduced.) Your light is next, Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Thank you, Senator Cudaback, colleagues. So where are we today? Well, I can...I'm only speaking for myself, and if it's an idea of any value, then I hope it benefits us in our service to the people. But if I were all alone giving the
