with. You can do that automatically, but you don't automatically get your case accepted by the U.S. Supreme Court, and I think Nebraska will lose on their appeal. And one of the factors that will come into play is the bad faith litigation that Nebraska engaged in throughout this process. This judge has already found that that bad faith, gorilla-type legislation was designed to frustrate the work of the commission. Bad faith litigation, that's not going to sit well with these other courts, whose resources are limited. That will be against Nebraska. I don't believe the U.S. Supreme Court would even hear it. So if Nebraska does lose, and a special master gets involved, you have...if you adopt this bill, you're out of the compact. Remember, in 1995, Nebraska brought a lawsuit to have a second member placed on the commission. Now you're passing a bill to say you'll have nobody on it. That is why Nebraska looks so schizophrenic in this in addition to being incompetent through their Attorney General. Courts are not going to be swayed by the stuff that will sway a Legislature, where you can say my constituents require me to say this, and I'm saying it for them. Courts are going to look at the facts, and you all are going to lose. I told you you were going to lose on the late-term abortion, or whatever you called it, but you got caught up in the political end of it. You passed it. I was the only one voting no, and the courts have gone my way. I'm able to look at these legal issues and others are too. But they're unwilling to face the reality that those issues present to us. The longer it goes on, the more litigation in which this state engages, the more money it's going to cost from the standpoint of the incompetent Attorney General frittering and wasting hundreds of thousands of dollars, frittering it away on bad, obviously bad cases, having to have your appeal which he guarantees you're going to lose. But, remember, the other side is spending money too. Who do you think they're going to try to get to absorb the costs that they had to incur defending bad, frivolous, obviously meritless lawsuits? There are prices to pay in the judicial system when you waste and force them...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.
