they went into this with their eyes closed or not being aware of the issues. If you don't know the issues, you can not say you didn't have the opportunity to learn the issues and courts often say what you know or should have known. The Legislature won't be punished. We can say and do anything we want to, and we have total immunity, but there are other forums in which we will not be granted immunity. Mr. President, I will ask for a call of the house...oh, I withdraw my bracket motion, but before we vote, I would ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote on this bill.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion is withdrawn. Is there any debate on the advancement of the bill? If not...Senator Landis, your light is on. Senator Wehrbein, your light is on.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr....I don't know, I have some questions. I don't know who to ask. Mr. President, and members, first of all, I don't know whether I should ask you, Senator Chambers, and if someone else would like to respond to this. So I'm clear on this, do you think it's possible that we could lose the process discussion with the federal courts and still not have to site in Nebraska or not be sanctioned? What...what's the result of losing the process other than economic sanctions, would you...
