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much wrong here that we need to just...we need to just get out of this thing, and we've been told that we don't have any liability for getting out other than the \$25,000 per year. But Judge Kopf's opinion injects some new potential ramifications for us that we didn't know existed before, didn't even know existed really when this bill came out of committee. And I don't understand all the ramifications of that decision, but it raises my level of anxiety as a state senator to the point that I don't know for sure what to do. And I don't know if what we do on this bill will have any effect on that. But I know this, that his decision raises the unthinkable possibility of someone other than our own state rendering a decision on whether or not that license should be granted, and whether or not that's a legal thing for him to do or not, I don't know. But it raises that aspect that wasn't in the mix before. So I do not...I do not, as a state senator, want to put us in a position of having a license granted and having a facility constructed that...that we're not a part of. And I also don't...I also don't know how long it's going to be before we know whether or not Judge Kopf's opinion and memorandum is going to lead to...lead us down that course but it probably will be at least a year before we have any further direction, and it very well could be longer than that. So with that,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...in my view the wiser course of action would be for us to either, for Senator Dierks, and this would...this is asking him for something that he probably is unable to do, but for us either to leave the bill where it's at, or leave it on Final Reading at least till next session till we have...to see if we have any more facts to shed light on the proper course of action, and nothing is going to be built in the meantime whether we withdraw or whether we don't. But if anything would develop in the meantime that would shed any more light on the proper course of action, we would have the benefit of that information. So that's where I'm at, rightly or wrongly, and I'm glad I had a chance to at least explain where I'm at. I didn't think that we'd still be on the bill when I was able to return, but I'm thankful that we are and that's my rationale. Thank you.
