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raising issues with the way this bill is drafted. There is a better way to draft it. Some of the amendments that I offer are to generate discussion. However, if adopted, they would improve the bill. Why would you limit a convention center to the instruction and education of the participants? There might be others who will attend who are not participants. They did not register. They are members of the public. The general public may be allowed to come in. And when we get to the issue of participants again, I want to find out if in order to determine attributable revenue the participants have to pay a fee to attend. There are so many questions left unanswered with the way this bill is drafted. But if I were the one drafting this bill, first of all, I wouldn't have any of these findings. They're superfluous, they do not accurately reflect the language in the bill itself. When we talk about what all of this is for, it is not just to construct a building. What are some of the things that the bill says can be done in this situation? The building can be...now in the definition, the building must be acquired, completed, or substantially reconstructed or expanded by a certain date. That's the definition. To get that date in place after which these things must occur, I presume so that nothing which had happened prior to that could use this bill, apply it retroactively on an already completed project. But as we go further, and I will show you by citing the location of these words what I'm talking about, but I haven't reached the point yet where I'm going to discuss it in detail, acquired, constructed, or operated is in the bill. Operated is not a part of the definition. At another place when we're talking about what general obligation bonds can be issued for to acquire, construct, and operate. Both give the same three words, acquired, constructed, or operated is the first one. Acquire, construct and operate is the second one. Some people may think this is nitpicking but it's not. To try to give an example which everybody can understand, let's say Senator Smith, who is a bachelor, is going to get married. Well, he can marry either Deb, Nancy, or Pam; but he cannot marry Deb, Nancy, and Pam without being in violation of the law. But in laying out these provisions talking about what can be done under the bill, in one place it says acquired, constructed, or operated. In the other it says acquire, construct and operate, all three. The other, any one is sufficient. And I think those are things that ought to be dealt with, but all I'm going to do is raise the
