SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would the picture that you have in your mind accommodate a trade show? And I'm not going to ask you to define it but as we generally understand a trade show?

SENATOR LANDIS: I would say yes and I'll tell you why. We've got like the Pershing Auditorium here or I've been to the Red Lion Inn in Omaha, whatever, and you'll find that area in which booths are set up, examples of wares are there and you're going through to take a look at potential purchases, major purchases in some cases. When I use the word trade show, that's what I see in my mind's eye and so, yes, I think it would be possible.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Before my time runs out...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...if there were a convention show, I meant a trade show and if there were a convention center and an auditorium in the city, at which place do you think the trade show would likely be?

SENATOR LANDIS: It could be either, I've certainly seen them in auditoriums. I suppose it depends on two things, first, the quality of the space, whether it fits the needs of the renters and, secondly, the price to lease.
