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because of those supporting it outside the Legislature, we cannot even comply with our usual methods of drafting legislation. And my job is to underscore and make clear how derelict the Legislature can be made when a powerful special interest group is at work. Everything in the way of legislative responsibility flies out the window. But I will be as clean, brothers and sisters, as Clorox. Well most of you all probably know what Clorox is. Now the reason I'm making this reconsideration motion is so that I'll have a chance to elaborate, because honoring Senator Landis' preferences, I will not ask him any questions on a reconsideration motion. But I do have a lot of questions that I will pose during the discussion of some of these other matters. One thing, so that Senator Landis may kind of get his thinking cap on, will be additional discussion about participants. I will want to go into more detail about general obligation bonds and the requirement that they be issued, such bonds be issued. I think what I will take a minute to do...oh, Senator Raikes is here. I'm going to discuss that board, because I do have an amendment dealing with that, but I don't know if I will take it to a vote because it would improve the bill. That board, which is to take care of making decisions on this bill, is discussed on page 2 of the committee amendments, in subsection (2), or lines 12 through 16. And this is what is said about the makeup of that board. "Board means a board", obviously. But let me continue. "Board means a board consisting of the Governor, the State Treasurer, the Chairperson of the Nebraska Investment Council, the Chairperson of the Nebraska State Board of Public Accountancy, and a professor of economics on the faculty of a state postsecondary educational institution, appointed to a two-year term by the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education." I would like to ask Senator Raikes a question.

SENATOR DIERKS: Senator Raikes, please.

SENATOR RAIKES: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Raikes, you're a member of the Revenue Committee, aren't you?

SENATOR RAIKES: Yes.
