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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Now the Chairperson of the Nebraska State Board of Public Accountancy, for how long is the person...the Chairperson of the State Board of Public Accountancy, if you know?

SENATOR RAIKES: I don't know, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How about the Chairperson of the Nebraska Investment Council, for how long is that person in that position?

SENATOR RAIKES: Again, I don't know the term for that, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I don't know the answer to these either, so I was seeking information. So, why then do we put this peculiar language with reference to this professor? Why don't we just say and...

SENATOR DIERKS: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...a professor of economics on the faculty of a state postsecondary educational institution, period, or, if that person is to be appointed by this Coordinating Commission, and leave out "a two-year term"?

SENATOR RAIKES: Again, I can't answer that question, Senator. I...I assume it would work the way you're proposing.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Could it be clarified, if we're going to talk about the terms of these people? We're treating one person differently from the way we're treating all the others, isn't that true?

SENATOR RAIKES: Yeah, that's true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And there is nothing about being a professor of economics, chuckle, chuckle, that should result in that, is there, that you know of?

SENATOR RAIKES: No, I don't, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Raikes. I'm going to
