PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Landis.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Landis, I had asked you about the possible seating capacity of this center, and you gave me a speculative answer. Is that the way it would still be today?

SENATOR LANDIS: Speculative?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR LANDIS: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you think that the answer you gave might be somewhere in the ballpark in terms of seating for these types of facilities?

SENATOR LANDIS: I was trying to responsive, and it was my best attempt to be responsive.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And would you give it again, because I don't want to misstate it.

SENATOR LANDIS: I think I said 1,500 to 2,000, something like that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's what I remember. Thank you, Senator Landis. I didn't want to make it a larger amount than Senator Landis had said. But before we get to the point...oh, and I have to ask him one more question, it's along the same lines, but I'm not going to give you a chance to go off into some of those deeper things.
