SENATOR COORDSEN: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Coordsen, is it correct, and this is for the record, not doubting Senator Jensen, that it will...this board or whoever is going to determine the amount of these multipliers and this other stuff that will determine how much goes toward attributable revenue under this scheme, no consideration will be given to the fact or the likelihood or the possibility that conventioners will be drawn away to Council Bluffs, which is in Iowa? No consideration will be given to that under this bill, is that true?

SENATOR COORDSEN: No. No, as I understand the way the multipliers would work, it will be for those segments of the Omaha area economy that would be increased by people from out of state spending money, that is, hotels, restaurants, those sorts of things and no consideration would be given, and this is for the record, for money to be spent outside of Omaha by people who come to the convention. For example, if there was perhaps someone took a side trip out to Mahoney to look that over, while they were attending the convention, there was no provisions for
