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thrust of this bill, one of the main ones, is that it will reduce tax burdens of state residents? Is that what you see coming out of this bill?

SENATOR REDFIELD: No, I do not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Redfield. I would like to ask Senator John Hilgert a question, if he would answer.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Hilgert.

SENATOR HILGERT: Yes, Mr. President.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Hilgert, you support this bill, don't you?

SENATOR HILGERT: I do, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would you support it to your constituents,...

SENATOR HILGERT: Well, that's...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...in talking to your constituents?

SENATOR HILGERT: It's one of the reasons I support this bill, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Will you argue that it's going to reduce tax burdens of state residents and that's why you support it?

SENATOR HILGERT: First of all, it doesn't generate very many arguments but, second of all, I wouldn't use that as one of the selling points, that this is somehow a tax cut measure. I think we've yet to debate that this session.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: On this bill?

SENATOR HILGERT: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, thank you, Senator Hilgert. That's all I have of Senator Hilgert. And that's my feeling, when we talk about tax cuts, we have bills that deal with tax cuts. This is
