SENATOR RAIKES: ...well, look, we generated additional sales and income tax money; we should be able to use this as we see fit. The danger, I think, is particularly if you end up allocating that revenue back to the project. It doesn't make any allowance for the fact that it costs the government money to provide services associated with that economic activity. If you have new people, new jobs, they require police protection. They require schools. They may require higher education. All of this requires funds. So I'm very concerned about the precedent, that we do not take into account the cost of servicing new activity in the state. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Raikes. On the motion to reconsider, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, in the first Star Wars movie, Darth Vader was in hot pursuit of this little fellow, I think they called him Luke Skywalker, or the Grasshopper, one of those, and he was trying to...this youngster was trying to evade Darth Vader, and these people with Darth Vader were being distracted by some of Luke's whoever...whatever his last name was, his friends. I pointed out the fact and I was excoriated by one of our less appreciative members for that. But here's what I want to do so that I won't bring Senator Landis out of his shell at this point. I'm going to start reading Section 8, which Senator Landis brought to our attention. It begins on page 6 on line 23. The board shall, on the basis of the application and evidence presented to it, make an estimate as to the amount of attributable revenue to be derived by the state from the proposed eligible facility.
