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this attributable revenue and that will be based on the impact of participant spending. The next sentence, quote, investment multipliers used by the board shall not exceed two. The board may use a lower economic multiplier than described in this section upon a review of expert testimony submitted in a public hearing and subject to a specific finding of the board. Now if this language in the law says that the finding is going to be based on the impact of participant spending, either it means that or it doesn't. So I think we have another inconsistency here and ambiguity, maybe even a contradiction. I believe that the term "multiplier" applies to the participants and their spending. Any finding relative to attributable income based on the language I just read, which I did not put in this bill, says that the finding shall be made on the basis of testimony submitted to the board as to the impact of participant spending. That's why I think participants and participation will represent such an important key to every thing in this bill. I don't fault Senator Landis for the argument he gave, and had I not read the bill as carefully as I have, I probably would have stumbled into the same error. But I'm sure when he gets an opportunity, when we get to a provision or a proposition that he can join the discussion on,...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...he will show me where the bill probably doesn't mean that this finding is to be based on the impact of participant spending. But I want to remind anybody who may be listening that what we're talking about here is not the finding section of the legislation, but the actual operative language and a very crucial aspect of it.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Mr. Clerk.
