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Senator Schrock pointed out the interim zoning that we're looking at. The counties that are zoned will provide for a hearing. And I believe on page 17 of the committee amendments we are also providing for written comments and I believe that in a written comment there is ample opportunity and good opportunity to provide scientific evidence and to also state the reasons that someone may have in regards to the entire issue. Again, I also support the democratic process. I believe, as all of the committee felt, that we need to protect our environment, but I agree that I believe this is overkill. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schmitt.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Yes, Mr. Speaker, members, I guess I got a couple questions. First, I've got a question of Senator Wehrbein.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Wehrbein, would you respond?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Yes, on that refusal at Gretna, who refused them?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: County planning commission.

SENATOR SCHMITT: County planning? So it never made it to DEQ.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Never made it to the county board.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Okay. That's what I was curious about there because I wondered who had stopped this, because we don't seem to have too much luck with DEQ stopping any of the big ones out there and I wondered if they were stopping a 25-head unit and we're allowing these large ones to come in. Second question I got is for Senator Preister. Yes, Senator Preister, on the meetings and stuff on the Title 130, the rules and regulations that they were proposing to change, and I don't have that in front of me so I'm not sure exactly what was going on, but does your amendment tighten that down of what they were trying to loosen up, I guess is the word I would use? Do you know?
