facilities which provides for, and then follows a list of the items that DEQ can require. And if you turn over on the back page and go to line...on page 20 and follow on down to line 15, you will see that one of the things that DEQ currently has the power to require are best management practices where appropriate to specific sites, et cetera, et cetera, et cetera, and it includes control as one of those...or odor as one of those areas where they can require best management practices. In areas other than odor, they've been able to require best management practices for many, many years, and that's been a very, very positive thing because, as new technologies advance, they are able to suggest industry that certain technologies should be adopted because they represent a better solution to problems and enable the protection of the environment perhaps without any additional cost. Okay, so that's how the definition of "best management practices" is used, so what happens then when you put the word...when you put the words "suggested" into the definition of "best management practices"? Senator Schrock, the way I read it, and this is why I have the amendment, DEQ could no longer require the actual practices, but could only require suggested schedules and suggested operating procedures and practices. In other words, the way I'm reading what is done here, it's taking away the...the power of DEQ to direct the use of best management practices and changes it only to the ability to suggest best management practices, and that's a big, big step backwards, if I'm reading this correctly. If there is some other reading of this or some other intent of this language, I hope that it's there because I would hate to think that the real intent of this amendment was to take away from DEQ their ability to insist upon best management practices. And so, absent a better explanation and even with a better explanation, I would suggest there must be other verbiage that would accomplish whatever other purpose there may be because this language, the way I read it and the way I think everybody would have to read it, is making best management practices only suggestions and not directives. And, for that reason then, I recommend to you the adoption of this amendment. Thank you.
