unnecessary. The things it does, it changes the time for the local governing body to make recommendations to the Liquor Control Commission from 30 days to 45 days. Gives them a little more time to investigate the person who is applying for the license. Sets forth the procedure for retail license application hearings before the commission. This is basically the same as their current procedure. Clarifies the procedure to appeal order canceling or revoking retail licenses. It changes the time for the local governing body to have a hearing on the application from 21 days to 45 days. Strikes language referring to the appeal process, which is not appropriate in that section. Provides that appeals are to be conducted pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act. It's clearly technical. Just ask for your...for your acceptance of this. It cleans up the bill quite a bit. Thank you.
