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LB 770

would not ask for further advancement this year. Is that what I heard him say?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. We won't pass it this year. So then we can do the same thing with the farmer bill, can't we, and not do any damage?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: LB 630 is on Final Reading.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But we don't have to pass it, do we? It can just sit there...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...can't it?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: We...it takes 25 votes to do anything in this body, and without 25 votes we don't do anything.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But there could be a request by the introducer not to act on the bill this year. Isn't that true?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And if the introducer insisted on acting on it, but we're not going to act on this bill, somebody might decide we need extended discussion to find out why there is a difference in treatment. Might that happen?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: If you're suggesting it and if that suggestion falls on fertile ground, it might happen.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Wickersham. You've been very helpful this morning. How much time do I have left on this time, Mr. President?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Fifteen seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers. Senator Wickersham, you're light is on next. Senator Wickersham waives off.
